The Ladies of Charity of the United States of America (LCUSA) provides Vincentian leadership to women acting together against all forms of poverty. LCUSA offers resources and support to a network of 57 local associations with a membership of 5,753 dedicated, faith-filled, hardworking and compassionate women who care deeply about people living on the margins of society. Young women of middle and high school age are engaged in twelve locations as Junior Ladies of Charity. LCUSA is also connected

to volunteers with the same mission in 52 other countries under the umbrella of the Founded in 1617 by St. Vincent de Paul, AIC is just two years away from a joyful celebration of the 400th anniversary of its from local associations across the country; provide forms and training materials; organize an annual national assembly which provides an opportunity for education and formation; administer a variety of grant programs to support the efforts of members to serve people in need; make donations in the event of disasters; and maintain a multi-media communication program.

LCUSA supports 57 local associations, serving 170 communities. In 2015, these associations raised and distributed

\$3,324,634 to those hours, a 24.5% living in poverty in their communities, a 38.3% increase from 2014. They volun-

increase from 2014. representing a value of over \$29,016,064.
