<u>Reader 1</u>: "... between the Feast of the Ascension and Pentecost ... honor the grace God bestowed on His Church by giving His Holy Spirit to guide it and by commissioning His Apostles to preach the Gospel to all nations. ... strive to be particularly attentive to the Word of God and His law expressed in His commandments.


Pause briefly for Reflection

<u>Prayer Response</u> ALL: "I adore You, O God, and recognize You are the author of my existence. Because of the love I owe You, I abandon myself entirely to Your holy will in my life. ... I beg You, because of the love You have for Your creatures, to send the ... Holy Spirit ... [to] all souls redeemed by the blood of Jesus Christ." Amen.
