Easter – Love Overcame

Readings: Acts 10: 34a, 37-43; Psalm 118: 1-2, 16-17, 22-23; Colossians 3: 1-4/1Corinthians 5: 6b-8; Sequence; John 20: 1-9

Scripture: "We are witnesses of all that [Jesus] did ... They put him to death by hanging him on a tree. This man God raised on the third day and granted that he be visible ... to us, the witnesses chosen by God ..." Acts 10: 39-41

Reflection: Jesus left the tomb behind. This points to His death. It also implies his resurrection. If I leave the tomb behind me, somehow, I've been resurrected as well. I've gotten up and walked out of the tomb. Today, we live out Jesus' story of life, death, resurrection throughout our lives. Whenever we experience a loss, or life doesn't turn out the way we want, or we have to give up a dream, a part of us dies. Yet the story doesn't end there. We can choose to get up and walk out of the tomb into new life. Doing so gives our suffering context, offers us hope. Let us cling to and live the resurrection today.
