

Attitude of Service

<u>Call to Prayer</u>: "...trust in Our Lord, who will be our help in the work we have begun and in the undertaking to which He has called us." (Coste XII: 388)

Attitude of Service (con't)

<u>Reading</u>: St. Vincent enumerates the motives we have for serving the physical and spiritual needs of persons living in poverty. "The first motive ... is that poor persons have the honor of representing the members of Jesus Christ, who considers the services rendered to them as done to himself. The second is that the souls of poor persons have the image of God imprinted upon them, and therefore we're bound to honor the Blessed Trinity in them. The third is that the Son of God has recommended this service to us by word and

example. To show the disciples of Saint John that He was the Messiah, He told them that the poor had the Gospel preached to them and the sick were healed. The fourth is that to assist a soul to save itself is to cooperate in the perfect fulfillment of God's plan in the death of Jesus Christ." (Coste IX: 51)

<u>Response</u>: ALL: We pray, O God "... for our good will, for a firm, genuine disposition to seize every opportunity of serving ..." You in persons who are poor. (Coste XI: 357)

Reflection and Sharing: Let us pause to reflect. Then share.

How does my service of others reflect my love for God?

What can I do to remind myself that my respect and care of another speaks to her/him of God?



<u>Response</u>: ALL: "As often as you did it for one of my least children, you did it for me."

(Matthew 25: 40)

Intercessions: Let us pray to God who sent Jesus as an example of service.

<u>Response</u>: ALL: Jesus, let us serve others for love of You.
