
Service to God through Poor Persons: St. Vincent de Paul



Introduction: As we conclude our 400th anniversary, let us listen to St. Vincent's words to the first Ladies. "The Confraternity of Charity (original name for Ladies of Charity) was instituted to honor its patron Our Lord Jesus Christ and His Holy Mother, and to assist poor [persons] corporally and spiritually ... by giving them food ... and by [assisting them] to live well in the future."

Psalm 34

- **Side 1** At times I could never cease praising God. Come and rejoice with me over God's goodness.
- **Side 2** What God has done for me He can do for you. Turn to Him.
- **Side 1** God's loving presence encompasses those who yield to Him. God is with them in the midst of their troubles and conflicts.
- **Side 2** God meets their emptiness with His abundance and shores up their weakness with His divine power.
- **Side 1** God is ever alert to the cries of His children. God feels and bears with them in their pains and problems.
- **Side 2** God is very near to those who suffer and reaches out to help those who are battered down.
- **Side 1** Even the children of God must experience affliction, but they have a loving God who will watch over them.
- **Side 2** The servant of God finds meaning and purpose even in the midst of suffering and conflict.

(Sing Antiphon again.)


