(Coste, St. Vincent, Letters and Conferences, vol. 3, #1199, p. 612-13, 1650)


**Leader:** O God, come to our assistance ALL: O Lord, make haste to help us.

## Prayer to Our Lady, Undoer of Knots (Pray together, please.)

O Mary, Mother of compassion, cast your eyes upon us and see the snarl of knots that exists in our world. Mary, Mother to whom God entrusted the undoing of knots in the lives of us, God's children, we entrust into your hands the chains that hold your people in fear and bondage. We believe that in you there is no knot that cannot be undone and retied into a bow. Powerful Mother, by your intercessory power with Jesus, our Liberator, take into your hands today these knots that bind our hearts, relationships, families, local, national, international and church communities. (*Pause and name aloud areas in need of prayer.*) Undo, for the glory of God and the benefit of your people, the threat of hate, violence, terror, warfare, death and destruction. Undo these tangled circumstances and make smooth and peaceful the communications and negotiations that will quiet fears and build trust and cooperation among all of us. Hear this plea on behalf of your people and provide, through God's care, hope, justice, peace for all.
