

Reading: In the *Joy of the Gospel*, Pope Francis writes: "... prayer moves us ... to take up the task of evangelization and to seek the good of others ... Let us peer for a moment into the heart of Saint Paul, to see what his prayer was like. It was full of people: "...I constantly pray with you in every one of my prayers for all of you... because I hold you in my heart." (Philippians 1:4, 7) Here we see that prayer ... always has a place for others. (#281) This attitude becomes a prayer of gratitude to God for others. "First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you." (Romans 1:8) It is constant thankfulness: ... "I thank my God in all my remembrance of you." (Philippians 1:3) ... It is a spiritual gaze born of deep faith which acknowledges what God is doing in the lives of others. At the same time, it is the gratitude which flows from a heart attentive to others. When evangelizers rise from prayer, their hearts are more open; freed ..., they are desirous of doing good and sharing their lives with others." (#282)




