St. Vincent loved this Scripture Passage: Matthew 25: 31-40

"While the **Christ** of St. Vincent remains 'Lord' and 'Son of God,' he **lives in the person of the poor. He continues to suffer** in them. Vincent says to the Daughters of Charity on February 13, 1646: **'In serving the poor, you serve Jesus Christ**... **you serve Christ in the person of the poor.**'

Vincent frequently cites Matthew 25 to reinforce the identification of Jesus with the poor: 'So this is what obliges you to serve them with respect, as your masters, and with devotion: that they represent for you the person of our Lord.'"
